Vincent Price of \_\_in the County of Amite in the State of Mississippi has applied to the Secretary of the Treasury for the benefits of the act, entitled "And Act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the Revolution," approved the 15th of May, 1828. He states that he enlisted in the Continental line of the Army of the revolution, for and during the war, and continued until its termination, at which period he was a Private -- in Captain Ellis's company, in the \_\_ Regiment of the North Carolina line; and that he received a certificate for the reward of \$80, provided by the resolve of the 15th of May, 1778; and further, that he was not on the 15th day of May, 1828, on the pension list of the United States, and that he received as a pensioner since the 3rd of March, 1826, nothing.

The Third Auditor is requested to report how far the several statements are corroborated by the records in his office.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of an "Act for the relief of certain surviving

officers and soldiers of the Army of the Revolution," approved on the 15th of May 1828 I Vincent Price of Amite County in the State of Mississippi, do hereby declare that I enlisted in the North Carolina line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war, and continued in the service until its termination, at which period I was a private in Captain James Ellis' Company in the 4th Regiment of the North Carolina line commanded by Colonel Thomas Robinson. And I also declare that I never received a certificate for a reward of \$80, to which I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed the 15th May 1778.

And I further declare that I was not on the 15th day of March 1828 on the pension List of the United States.
