Pension Application of Isaac Cliatt R20341 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

[6 Oct 1828] For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of "An Act for the relief of certain surviving officers and Soldiers of the army of Revolution" approved on the fifteenth of May Eighteen hundred and twenty eight I Isaac Cliatt of the 119th district in the County of Richmond in the State of Georgia do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the army of the revolution for and during the war and continued in the service untill its termination, at which period I was a private in Captain McIntoshes company in the [blank] regiment of the Southern line, and and I further declare that I was not on the fifteenth day of March Eighteen hundred and twenty eight on the pension list of the United States

NOTES:

Isaac Cliatt signed his name to a power of attorney.

The only McIntosh listed as a Captain at the end of the Revolutionary War in Francis B. Heitman's *Historical Register of Officers of the Continental Army During the War of the Revolution* was William McIntosh of Georgia.
