Declaration made by William Feagans Sen'r. a private, For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of "an act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the army of the revolution," approved on the 15th of May 1828.

I William Feagans Sen'r. of the revolution, in the County of Morgan, in the state of Georgia, do hereby declare, that I enlisted in the Continental line of the army of the revolution, for and during the war, and continued in service untill its termination, and at which period I was a private, in Captain Joseph Blackwell's [pension application S37781] Company, in the third regiment of the Virginia Line. And I also declare that I never afterwards, got nor recieved a certificate for the reward of Eighty Dollars to which I was entiled, under a resolve of Congress, passed the 15th of May 1778. Not knowing I was entiled, nor my bounty of Land, either. And I further declare that I was not on the 15th of Mach 1828 on the pention List of the United States, and also I further declare I served faithfully during the war at the close I recieved an honorable dicharg from Joseph Blackwell Captain of the third regiment virginia Line. And in 1783 I had the misfortune to have my house and all my papers and discharge bured in my house, as aforesaid
