Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." On this the 26th day of December A.D. 1855 personally appeared before me O. F. Adams a Notary Public within and for the State and County aforesaid Mary Nichols aged about 82 years a resident of Bibb County in the State of Georgia who being duly sworn according to law declares that she is the widow of William Nichols deceased who was a Soldier in the Revolutionary War in the South I that she has always understood from him from the first acquaintance with him. That the said William Nichols served in the Continental or State line of South Carolina in said war for one year or more.

That she was married to the said William Nichols on the __ day of __ 18__ in Jones County by one John McKensey a Baptist Minister that her name before marriage was Mary Young and that she is now a widow she makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining a land Warrant under the act of March 3, 1855. That she has never applied for nor received a Land Warrant under this or any other act of Congress.
