State of Tennessee County of Henderson

On this 27th day of March A.D. 1854 personally appeared before me an acting Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid William Diffie a resident of Henderson County, in the State of Tennessee, age 65 years, who being duly sworn according to law, doth upon his oath declare, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed July 7th 1832 [sic], That his farther [sic, father] John Diffie, served in the Revolutionary War as he has heard him say, in the State of North Carolina. He further declares that his father died in the year A.D. 1835, on the fifth day of February and that he left no widow him surviving.

Sworn to and subscribed before me the day and year above written. And I hereby certify that "John" was the racist and William interlined previous to administering the oath.
