Chambers County } Be it known, that before me Benjamin F Harrist [sic: Benjamin F.
Harris] a Justice of the Peace, in and for the county aforesaid, duly authorized by law to administer oaths,
personally appearer Lucy Drinkard, widow of John Drinkard Deceased and made oath in in due form of
Law, that she is the widow of John Drinkard Deceased, the identical person, who was a private in the
company commanded by Captain Jacob Moon [see endnote] in the war of the Revolution. he Volunteered
in Amelia County State of Virginia, & entered the War of the Revolution and fought at the Battle at
Guildford Court House, North Carolina [sic: Guilford Courthouse NC, 15 Mar 1781], and is now dead.
he died in the year AD 1817 in the month of march in said year. he resided in Edgefield District, South
Carolina five years, then removed to Abbeville District, S.C. and lived there untill his Death which was

Chambers County \ \ On this seventh day of November AD. one thousand eight Hundred and
fifty, personally appeared before me Benjamin F. Harrist a Justice of the peace in and for the county &
state aforesaid Lucy Drinkard a resident of Alabama in the County of Chambers aged Eighty one years,
who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath make the following declaration in order to
obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed July 7 <sup>th</sup> 1838 entitled "An act,
granting half pay and pensions to certain Widows that she is the Widow of John Drinkard Deceased,
who was a private in the Army of the Revolution, who was a private in the company commanded by
Captain Jacob Moon of Amelia County State of Virginia. Said John Drinkard fought at the Battle fought

at Guildford Court House North Carolina She further declares that she was married to the said John Drinkard in the year AD 1785 in the month of March (the day not recollected, there being no family Record of the marriage. That her husband, the aforesaid John Drinkard, died in the year AD one thousand eight Hundred and Seventeen in the month of March (the day of that month not recollected that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service but the marriage took place previous to the first of

January seventeen hundred and ninety four, Viz. at the time above stated
