Pension Application of David Gooding (Goodin) R4109 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. Ann (Anna) Goodin

The State of Ohio, Muskingum County ss.

Before me, the Subscriber, a Justice of the peace for and within said said County, personally came Sarah Roberts, (formerly Sarah Gooding) who being duly sworn, according to law, deposeth and saith, I am the sister of David Gooding (goodin) now dec'd. as I am satisfactorily informed and believe and that he was the Husband of Ann Gooding formerly Ann Birdsall, (now his widow) who Applied for a pention under a late Act of Congress as the widow of said David Gooding, who served as a soldier in the revolutionary war of the United States (or Colonies with England, – was drafted in to the Army against England, some time previous to the surrender of Cornwallas to the American forces, but as to how long he continued to serve I can not now recolect or state – but I am quite certain that he continued in the Army or war until the time of said surrender
