Pension Application of Simon Harris R4684 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. Revised 25 March 2012.

On this 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1855 personally appeared before me the State of Tennessee } **Knox County** undersigned a Justice of the Peace of and for said County and State Rebecca Harris to me well and personally known, a credible witness and a person of respectability, who having been first sworn by me in due form of law makes the following declaration in order to obtain a pension from the United States, on account of services of her deceased husband. She is eighty one years old, and the widow of Simon Harris, she was informed by her husband frequently during his life time that he had been a soldier of the Revolution, for at least six months, that he was in service at the time peace was declared and was in the battle of Yorktown when Cornwallis surrendered [19 Oct 1781]. She is unable to give the names of the officers under whom he served from Greensville County and State of Virginia, she was married to him in that County and State March 1st A.D. seventeen hundred and ninety five, she removed with her husband to this county, thirty eight years ago. Her said husband died in this county May 11<sup>th</sup> 1831 – she is now a widow and has been ever since the death of her said husband. She makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the Knoxville Tennessee agency at such rate per annum as she may be entitled to receive, under any and all acts of Congress granting pensions to the widows of revolutionary soldiers. She has no private of her marriage and knows of no public record thereof. She requests that her claim may be examined and a certificate issued and sent to her agents Messers Kain & Jones Knoxville Tennessee. Rebecca herXmark Harris

NOTE: On an application for bounty land dated 12 Apr 1855, Rebecca Harris stated that her name before marriage was Rebecca Davis.
