On this [?]<sup>th</sup> day of September A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty three, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, within and for the County and State aforesaid, Jane Robinson, aged 67 years, a resident of Madison county, in the State of Tennessee, who being duly sworn according to law declares that she is the daughter of Joseph Hudson who was a Revolutionary soldier and served two tours in the State of Virginia, and she has heard him speak of his services in said war. She further declares that her father Joseph Hudson died in Henderson county, in the State of Tennessee on the 14th day of October 1827, leaving a widow Ann Hudson to whom he was married previous to 1794. She further declares that her mother, Ann Hudson, lived until the 7<sup>th</sup> of July 1844 in the county of Madison, in the State of Tennessee and that she remained a widow until her death. She further declares that her mother left five heirs, to wit, John Hudson, Jane Robinson, James Hudson, Richard W Hudson, Sarah Thompson, all of whom are now living with the exception of the aforesaid Richard W. Hudson, who died in Madison county.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining for herself and brothers and sisters the benefit of the act of Congress passed July 7th 1832. [signed] Jane Robison

NOTES: M. F. Robison and James W. Robison made supporting statements. The claim was rejected, probably because of insufficient proof of service and of the marriage.
