Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

[The file cover indicates that Archibald McClellan was a resident of SC in 1846. It does not indicate where he claimed to have served. The only documents of substance in this file are 2 letters, one dated January 12 1846 purporting to enclose the application of Archibald McClellan; and the other dated March 19 1846 withdrawing the application -- both letters are signed by WB Maclay [William Brown Maclay was the Representative from NY in 1846—why was he submitting this claim (and withdrawing it)?]
