Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." State of Kentucky Laurel County to wit

On this 13th day of January 1845 personally appeared in open Court before the Court of Laurel County now sitting John McDowell a resident of Laurel County State of Kentucky aged eighty-seven years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832.

That he enlisted in the Army of the United States the 15th of March 1775 with James Robertson and served in the 11th Regiment of the Continental line under the following named officers Robert Lawson Colonel John Crute Captain Thomas McCammack Lieutenant Mr. William McCammack Ensign and left the service on the 27th day of October 1781, that he resided in the County of Amelia in the State of Virginia before he entered the service that he was engaged in the battles of the White Plains [October 28, 1776], Gilford [Guilford Court House, March 15, 1781] and York Town [October 19, 1781 being the date on which Cornwallis surrendered at Yorktown] that he was marched through the States of Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia and North Carolina. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State.
