Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Col. Alexander Donley aged 57 and says he has known Mellehon [sic] since he was boys—Met with him recently and are talking of their respective ages – Mollehn [sic], made himself a year or two older than himself (Donly [sic]) – they were boys together in Greenbrier County –

Sennats Triplett, Benjamin Lemaster & George Rader [could be Raden] all old and respectable Gentlemen. Say they are well acquainted with Mollehon and have known him many years. – And that he is but 60 years old. Rader says he himself is in his 58<sup>th</sup> year and that Mollehen [sic] & himself were boys together, and about the same age.
