Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." On this the 27th day of August A.D. 1853 personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, Thomas P Oliver, aged forty-four years, who being duly sworn according to law declares that he is the grandson of Robert Oliver who was a corporal in the first Troop first Regiment of Light Dragoons commanded by Benjamin Temple in the "Continental line" during the Revolutionary War. He further declares that his said grandfather, Robert Oliver has no first children, now living, that there are now living fifteen grandchildren. He further declares that his grand-mother, the widow of Robert Oliver, died in the year A.D. 1830 or 1831, not recorded and consequently cannot be certain which.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the pension money due his grandfather and mother, for the benefit of himself and other heirs,
