Isaac Philips Applicant.

Henry Philips [pension application R8193] Brother of Isaac (an elder Brother) says that Isaac never done any service in the war of the Revolution that Isaac is now in his 67th year of age, Isaac was in service against the Indians in 1785 & 1786 & 1787. – Johnson Neulan [sic: Johnson Newlon & Jonathan Wamsley first called on his brother Isaac to get him a Pension – and after they had been at his brothers house for that purpose, James Bennett called & wrote his declaration – he was sworn to it before [Jacob] Keller a Magistrate of Ran'h cty [Randolph County]
