[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." State of Alabama, County of Randolph SS

On this 23rd day of January 1857, personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace in and for the County and State aforesaid Keziah Pritchett aged 93 years who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she was the widow of Jeptha Pritchett and was formerly the widow of David Moore, who served in the War of American Independence from the State of North Carolina. She does not recollect under what officers he the said David Moore served, but she refers the Department to her application for a pension under the Act of 7th July 1838, suspended.³

She further states that she was married to the said David Moore in or about the year 1779. She also refers the Department to her said application for a pension for full proof of her husband's service, marriage and the death of her said husband, David Moore. She also declares that she was a widow on the 3rd day of March 1855, and is now a widow.

She makes this Declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which she may be entitled under the Act of March 3rd, 1855, never having received no applied for Bounty land under this or any other Act of Congress.

She authorizes Thomas Lumpkin of Washington City DC to prosecute her claim and receive any warrant or certificate which may be issued here on.
