On this 20<sup>th</sup> day of Nov 1832 personally appeared in open court before the county court of Garrard County now sitting George Floyd aged about seventy six years, a resident citizen of the afd county & state. Who being first duly sworn doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed 7<sup>th</sup> June 1832. That he served as soldier in the Virginia militia eleven months as follows (to wit) as a volunteer for one month un the year 1778 under Captain Butler, Lieut. Rice Dabney at which time of entering the service he resided in the county of King William, State of Virginia. He does not recollect the names of his other officers. That in the year 1779 he again entered the service

Still residing in the same county (King William) as a volunteer for two months under Captain David Parnell. He has forgotten the names of his other officers. That again in the year 1780 he volunteered for four months in the afd county of King William under Capn Quarles, Kilpatrick was his Major and Innis his Col. He marched to Williamsburg Virginia, remained there but a short time and was then marched to Hampton where he continued to serve until his time expired. He again volunteered and served one month under Capn David Jimmerson [David Jamison], Quarles was his Major, Richardson was Col. He was attached to Gnl. Lawson's brigade. He went this tour from the county of Caroline State of Virginia and before he returned home there was a call for volunteers at the Mabin Hills [Malvern Hills] to which place he and his brother John went. and again

Volunteered for three months under Capn D. Jimmerson, Stephens was the major, Innis the Col. They were attached to the command of Gnl La Fayette. He served all his tours of duty faithfully but has no written evidence of his service. He knows of no witness by whom he can establish the facts except his brother John who was with him in all his tours and always in the same corps with the exception of the first month referred to in this declaration.

He hereby relinquishes every claim to a pension except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state.
