Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

On this eleventh day of July 1822; before me, the subscriber, a Justice of the peace for the said County of Craven personally appeared Harman Gaskins who, on his oath, declare he is the same person who formerly belonged to the company commanded by Captain Charles Crawford in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Patton [John Patten] in the service of the United States; that his name was placed on the pension roll of the state of North Carolina that he never received a formal Certificate, but for several years has drawn his pension; He now wishes to obtain a formal certificate.
