Be it known that Michael Reep this day personally appeared before me Jacob Ramsour a Justice of the peace for the said County of Lincoln and to on his oath declares that he is the same identical Michael Reep who relate least serve a private in the Revolutionary War in the company commanded by Captain John Barber attached [indecipherable word] Regiment [several words obliterated] certificate under the signature & seal of the Secretary of War placing him on the pension list of the United States but has for some time drawn his pension as an invalid pensioner from the proper Authority of North Carolina and the United States agency for the State of North Carolina at Fayetteville.
