[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of Georgia Campbell County

On this tenth day of June 1833 personally appeared before Isaac Howell, George Harris, James Strawn, & Alfred J. Crisp Justices of the Inferior Court of said County of Campbell John Fluker a resident of Campbell & said State, aged Eighty years, who being duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed June 7th, 1832.

That he enlisted in the Army of the United States, in the year 1776, with Capt. Lochlan McIntosh [Lachlan McIntosh], and served in the Regiment-first Battalion of Continental Troops of Georgia, under the following named officers that he enlisted in the beginning or spring of the 1776 under Capt. L. McIntosh in the County of Greene (as he now thinks) of the State of Georgia where he resided -- that Col. Joseph Habersham Commanded the Regiment -- That he was marched to Savannah, from thence to Augusta and was there at the Siege of Augusta. That in consequence of old age and the loss of memory he cannot recollect any other field or Company officers. That he acted in the Capacity of a Sergeant for & during the tour term of twelve months which embraced the term of his service, and received his discharge at Savannah the 3rd of April 1777, which discharge he sheweth about as additional evidence. That [he] hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and he declares that his name is not on the pension Roll of any Agency of any State.
