Private in Lt Potter's company of Col F Taylor's Virginia
Regiment for two years

Issued 02Nov1832 for \$80/annum

(p3) State of Kentucky
Campbell County

On this 24th day of August 1832 personally
appeared before the justices of the County Court of
Campbell County, State of Kentucky, Dudley Ellis, a
resident of the said County of Campbell and state of
Kentucky aged 69 years, who being first duly sworn
according to law, doth on his oath make the following
declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision
made by the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832. That he
enlisted in the Army of the United States in the year 1778
or 1779, with Ensign Samuel Overton Pettus, and served in
the Regiment of guards in Albemarle County of the
Virginia line, on Continental establishment under the
following named officers, Capt Robin Barnett, who never
came to take the command of the company and Ensign
Pettus who was raised to a Lieutenant and took the
command of the company – Francis Taylor was the
Colonel and _____ Roberts the Major under whom he
served – That he remained in the service two years and was
discharged at Harper's Ferry. – That he lived in Hanover
County, State of Virginia, when he enlisted & entered the
service. – That he was in no battle whist in the regular
service. – That he was stationed at Albemarle Barracks
upwards of two years, and marched from there to
Winchester & then to Harper's Ferry. – He hereby
relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an
annuity except the present and he declares that his name is
not on the pension roll of any Agency in any state.

(p3) And the said court do hereby declare their opinion, that the above named applicant was a revolutionary soldier and served as he states. –

(p13) Application for transfer
State of Kentucky
Campbell Cty

On this twenty fifth day of July 1833 before me the subscriber a Justice of the peace for the said Cty of Campbell personally appeared Dudly Ellis who on his oath declares that he is the same person who formerly belonged to the company commanded by Capt R Barnett in the regiment commanded by Col Taylor and Major Roberts in the service of state troops of Virginia called the Regiment of Guards, that his name was placed on the pension roll of the state of Kentucky and that he now resides in Campbell Cty State of Kentucky where he intends to remain but wishes his pension to be payable in future in Cincinnati Ohio State for the following reasons Viz he is very old and infirm and that he cannot go to Lexington only thru much difficulty and expense being a distance of about 70 or 80 miles, whereas if he could get his pension transferred to Cincinnati when he went to the Clerk's office to get the County seal he could draw his pension with but little trouble or expense, having only to cross the Ohio River, hence he solicits a transfer.
