Personally appeared in open court of Common Pleas of said county before the judges thereof on the 2nd day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three George Bealor a resident of Turkeyfoot township in the County of Somerset and State of Pennsylvania aged seventy one years and about eight months who having been first duly sworn according to law deposeth and saith and maketh the following declaration on his oath aforesaid in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832.

That he was born in Auspach Prussia in the year 1762 – that he emigrated to America in the year 1777 and landed at Staten Island from thence went to Philadelphia thence to Shepherdstown in Virginia where he enlisted in General Armands [Charles Armand's] Legion in the service of the United States for one year with Captain Barren of said Corps that he served in said Corps as a private for one year during which time he was marched from Shepherdstown to Winchester Virginia and from Winchester to York Pennsylvania where he was discharged that his discharge is now lost Major Shafner [George Schaffner] was the Major of said legion. That after his discharge as aforesaid he went to Shepherdstown thence he removed to Bedford Pa. From Bedford he removed to Somerset county where he hath resided ever since. That he has no documentary evidence of his service in his possession and that the declarant does not know of any person living in this part of the country and has been able to find no one who has a personal knowledge of his services.

That he hereby relinquishes all and every claim to a pension or an annuity except the present and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state
