On this 5<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 The State of Ohio Clinton County Ss Personally appeared in open Court before George J Smith President Judge and Jesse Hughes Aaron Sewell and James Dakin Esquires his associates in office constituting the Court of Common Pleas in and for said County William Floyd a resident of Vernon Township in the County of Clinton aforesaid aged about 70 years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June the 7<sup>th</sup> 1832. That he enlisted on the continental establishment in the Army of the United States in the year 1781 on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of October as well as he recollects in the Company commanded by Captain William Johnson [William Johnston BLWt1166-300] whose Lieutenants were Archibald Campbell and Thomas Coverlin and served in the Regiment Commanded by Colonel Hawes [Samuel Hawes BLWt1066-450] in the Virginia line That he cannot recollect the number of said Regiment nor can he set forth the names and rank of the field officers for the following reasons towit At the time of his enlistment aforesaid (which was for and during the war) he resided in the Town of Alexandria Fairfax County Virginia where he was enlisted, and from which he had not been removed at the time Cornwallis and his army were captured [19] Oct 1781] and after which there was an entire cessation of arms and the only service this deponent ever performed was as follows Shortly after the surrender of Cornwallis he with 9 or 10 other recruits were marched from Alexandria aforesaid by a sergeant to Winchester and attached to the troops there employed in guarding the prisoners which had been taken in which service this deponent was engaged until about the 4<sup>th</sup> day of July 1782 when he was discharged under the proper handwriting of said Colonel Hawes which discharge has long since been lost and gone from deponent [see below]. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity except the present, and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state William hisXmark Floyd
