## Robertson County Tenesee State

This 15th day of may 1833 persanally apeard in open Court Before the County Court of Robertson In the State of tenesee now sitting in the town of Springfeeald in Robertson County Dudley Brook a residant in the County and state aforsaid aged seventy one or two years the 22 of July 1833 who being first duley sworn according to law doth on oath make the following decelaration in order to obtain the Benefit of the Act of Congress past June the 7, 1832 States that he was born in Chesterfield County in the State of Virginia on the 22 day of July 1761 or 1762 as he was Informd and after som years moovd to Buckingham County in the said state and ther livd in sd Buckingham County ten or twelve years then was drafted to go in the surves for a six months tower as a mullitaman som time in the spring of 1781 and was under Robert Carey Captain in the sd Cty and James Burney lutinant Robert Blanks first Sargent and Was plast in a redgment I believe comanded by Col holborn and Major Walkins of princeedward [sic: Prince Edward] County in a brigade comanded I think by General Stephens [sic: Edward Stevens] and was marcht to Ritchmond in Virginia then to a place cald the mobin hills [sic: Malvern Hill, 15 mi SE of Richmond] ther stude som time then started to the north and mooved from place to place then Recvd an Express to go to york went by Cabbin pint [sic: Cabin Point on James River in Surry County] then to Williamsburg on our way to little yorke to atack Cornwallis and whist in the town of williamsburg was taken sick and put in a horspittle in the sd town where I remaind sick near two months confind in the horspittle somtime after Wallis was taken [sic: Cornwallis, 19 Oct 1781] and the men all dischargd somtime after I was taken by a friend from ther and kep untill was able to git home never got a discharge from no one States he servd in all about seven months Including the time he was in the horspittle said Brook further states that he has no Record of his age – that he knows of no witness living by whom his services can be proven – nor has he any written eivdence to prove the same – that he remained in Buckingham many years after the war & removed then to the State of Tennessee & resided several years in different parts of the state & about Eighteen years ago removed to Robertson County where he yet resides. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present & declars that he is not on the pension Roll of the agency of any state & refers to Wm. L Armstron & Martin Walter Clergyman for his character [signed] Dudley Brooke
