Pension application of David Kerr S31186 Transcribed by Will Graves f27VA 11/19/13

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

The declaration of David Kerr in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress of the 7th of June 1832. On this 20th day of August 1832 David Kerr personally appeared before the Justices of Scott County Court Resident of said County & State seventy-five years old 18th of February last being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress the 7th of June 1832.

David Kerr states that during the revolutionary war he was a resident Citizen of Virginia in the County of Albemarle. That in the month of August in the year 1776 he commenced [as a volunteer of militia duty for a period of upwards of three months against the Cherokee Indian tribe under Lieutenant Colonel Lewis & Colonel Christie [William Christian] commanded the whole Corps which consisted of 1400 men. He states that about the 1st of March 1778 he entered the service of the United States a regular soldier under Captain John Marks, Abram Murry was Lieutenant, was a part of the 14th Virginia Regiment commanded by Colonel William Davis [William Davies] Abram Buford [Abraham Buford] Lieutenant Colonel, Samuel Jordan Cabell Major that he was discharged after serving his two years at the last of February 1780 [indecipherable words] lost his discharge, was at the campaigns, Battle of Monmouth [June 28, 1778], the storming of Stony Point [July 16, 1779] on the Hudson River was in skirmishes not now remembered refers the Secretary of War to the Rolls of his office here his name is found on the list of Soldiers of the Virginia line as stated by the letter of Colonel James L Edwards. [Note: the balance of the document is in a totally different handwriting]

and the said David stated upon his oath in open Court that he does hereby relinquish every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension Roll of the Agency of any State.

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$80 per annum for service as a private for 2 years in the Virginia service.]
