Pension application of John Ralston S31321 Transcribed by Will Graves f19VA 6/4/12

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Commonwealth of Kentucky Harrison County: Sct.

On this 10th day of September 1832 personally appeared in open court before the justices of the County aforesaid now sitting John Ralston a resident of the Commonwealth and County aforesaid aged 77 years who being duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832.

That in the spring of 1778 under a regulation that a certain number (not now recollected) of single men were to furnish a regular soldier to serve in the Army of the United States for twelve months; he was drafted from the County of Greenbrier in the State of Virginia and after being sworn in as regular soldier he joined the Continental Army at Valley Forge in the State of Pennsylvania and served with Ensign Boen, Lieutenant Breckenridge under Captain Andrew Wallace attached to the 12th Regiment commanded by Colonel Nevil [John Neville] of General Charles Scott's brigade of the Virginia line. When the British Army left Philadelphia, our Army then under the command of General Washington met the British and fought the battle of Monmouth [June 28, 1778]; after which we went to Brunswick where we had a day of rejoicing. We then went to White Plains in the State of New York. From thence we went to a place called Robinson's farm owned the Hudson River, below, and near to West Point; from thence to Middlebrook in New Jersey where we lay all winter. In the spring of 1779 his term of service having expired he received his discharge and went home. He remained in Virginia 4 or 5 years; he then came to Kentucky where he resided about 48 years. I John Ralston do hereby relinquish every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity except the present, and declare that my name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state or territory whatever. He further states that he has lost his discharge; and that he knows of no living witness by whom he can prove his services.
