Robertson County } personally appeared Thomas Fisher Sr Resident of the County & State afforesaid In open Cort now in Cession Aged between seventy three & four years who being first duly sworn according to Law do On his Oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision of the act of Congress passed June the 7 1832 that he entered the service under the following named officers & served as her in stated first I substituted in my sixteenth year for John Smither under Captain Francis Degraftonreed [sic: Francis Degraffenreid] & Lutennant Nite [probably Knight] in Luningberg [sic: Lunenburg] County Virginia and marched to petersberg [sic: Petersburg] where I was discharged for my three months tower Then I returned home Then I was drafted for three months and placed under the command of Sterling Niblet Captain in Geneal Lossens [sic: Robert Lawson's] Brigade & marched from Luningberg County to portsmouth I was either discharged at portsmouth or Nancymond [sic: Nansemond] do not recollect which Then I returned home and was drafted for another tour of duty and marched to the Seige of York whare Colonel Wallis was taken [sic: Cornwallis, 19 Oct 1781] Marched down James River to Old Jamestown & crossed from thence to Williamsberg [sic: Williamsburg] then up York River through Gloster [sic: Gloucester] County & stationed near the town and held in rediness untill Wallis surrendered under the command of Obadiah Clay, Captain my field and Staff Officers not recollected

I further state that my discharges is misslaid or lost and I know of no person by whom at this time his testimony I can procure who can testify my service nor no other documents which will prove the fact at this time And I herby relinquish every claim whatever to a pention or annuity except the present and declare my name is not on any pention rool of the agency of any state sworn to & subscribed the date above mentioned

Personally appeared before me the undesigned a Justice of the peace for Robertson County State of Tennessee Thomas Fisher who being duly sworn depseth and saith that in order to amend the within declaration for a pension that he entered in the service as a Volunteer in the militia in my sixteenth year in the year of seventy six and served as hertofore stated two towers of three months each the third and last tower of three months was in the year eighty one when Wallis was taken at York I was at and in service at the same time and place and served in said tower not less than one month in the whole seven months I claim a pention for

That the record of my age is on record in my fathers Bible in the State of Kentucky in the possession of my brother John who has given me the record since makeing out my former declaration which states I was born the 11 of Febury 1760 in New Kent County State of Virginia Next the named persons known in my present neighbourhood which application can be made and who can testify as to my charater & veracity and beleaf of my services in the Revolution Martin Walton Henry Fisher Amos Moor Joshua Howard Danniel Clark John Bernard And further the deponet saith not Sworn to and subscribed this the the 17 of Aprile 1833

NOTE: In a letter dated 14 June 1837 Anthony Fisher stated that he was the son of Thomas Fisher. A Treasury-Department document shows that the Executor of Thomas Fisher received his final pension payment to the date of his death, 1 Dec 1841.

August Term 1832, August personally appeared Thomas Fisher Sn resident of the county & state aforesaid in open court now in session aged between seventy three & four years who being first duly sworn according to law do on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision of the act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832. That he entered the service under the following named officers & served as herein stated: First I substituted in my sixteenth year for John Smither under Captain Frances Degraftonreed & Lieutenant Nite in Lunenberg County Virginia and marched to Petersburg where I was discharged for my three months and placed under the command of Sterling Neblet Captain in General Lassens Brigade & marched from Luningberg [sic] County to Portsmouth. I was either discharged at Portsmouth or Nancymond [sic] do not recollect which. Then I returned home and was drafted for another tour of duty and marched to the siege of York where Colonel Wallis was taken. Marched down James River to Old Jamestown & crossed from thence to Williamsburg then up York River. Crossed above the fork thence down the river through Gloster [sic] County & stationed near the town and held in readiness until Wallis surrendered under the command of Obadiah Clay captain. My field and staff officers not recollected. I further state that my discharges is mislaid or lost. And I know of no person by whom at this time his testimony can procure who can testify my service nor no other documents which will prove the fact at this time and I hereby relinquish every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declare my name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state. Sworn to & subscribed the date abovementioned.
