Pension Application of Samuel Hurst S34933 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. MD

Fourth Judicial District of the State of Maryland

On this fifth day of November 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Fourth Judicial District of the state of Maryland, personally appears Samuel Hurst aged fifty four years, resident in Dorchester County in the said district, who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary war, That the said Samuel Hurst enlisted in the third Regiment in the state of Maryland in a company commanded by Captain James Gray [James Woolford Gray] that he entered the service of the United States in the Spring of the year 1781 [last digit unclear] and was dishcarged in November in the year 1783 at Frederic town [sic: Frederick] in Maryland. That he was at the siege of little york and the capture of Cornwallis [19 Oct 1781] and was engaged in several skirmishes in South Carolina near Charleston – and that he is in [undeciphered word] circumstances and the assistance of his country will be gratefully received; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.

I hereby certify that it appears from the pay Rolls remaining in the Auditors office that Samuel Hurst received from John Hamilton agent of the Maryland line the sum of \$215.50 for arrears of pay from the 1 day 1780 to the 1 Jan'y 1782 also the sum \$80 for pay from the 1 Jan'y 1782 to the 1 Jan'y 1783 and also the sum \$43.30 for pay from the 1 Jan'y 1783 to the 15 Nov'r 1783 when his time expired
