Pension Application of Edward Mahony S34970 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. MD

District of Columbia, SS.

On this 9th day of April 1818, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Circuit Court of the United States for the said district, personally appears Edward Mahony aged 58 years, resident in Prince Georges Co'y. Maryland, who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:" That he the said Edward Mahony enlisted in Frederic [sic: Frederick] County in the state of Maryland in the company commanded by Captain John Smith of the 6th Maryland Reg't; that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States until the year seventeen hundred & eighty three when he was discharged from service in Morristown state of New Jersey, that he was in the battles of Germantown [4 Oct 1777] Brandywine [11 Sep 1777], & at the Seige of little York [Yorktown, 28 Sep -19 Oct 1781] and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services except the annexed certificate
