Pension Application of Bartholomew Carrol S35827 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

Be it remembered that on the fifth day of September, Eighteen hundred and eighteen personally came before me the undersigned Judge of the District Court of the United States in and for the said District, Bartholomew Carrol, aged ninety six years, resident in the County of Dearborn, in the said District who being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "an act to provide for certain persons, engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war". That he the said Bartholomew Carrol, at New London [in Bedford County, now Campbell County], in the state of Virginia, about the first day of June in the year seventeen hundred and eighty enlisted in the Company commanded by Captain George Stripling [possibly George Stribling], of the Regiment of Colo. [Samuel] Hawes, of the Virginia Line. That he continued to serve in the said Corps or in the service of the United States, untill the first day of January seventeen hundred and eighty two, when he was discharged the service at Guilford in the State of North Carlona. That he was in the battles of Guilford [Guilford Courthouse NC, 15 Mar 1781], Camden [Battle of Hobkirk Hill near Camden SC, 25 Apr 1781], and Eutaw Springs [8 Sep 1781] & That he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support.

District of Indiana

On the 28th day of October 1820 personally appeared in open court being a court of record in and for the second judicial of said State of Indiana, so made a court of record by the constitution and laws of the said State. Bartholomew Carrol aged ninety eight years resident in said county & state who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows in Colo. Hawes 2^d. Virginia reg't. Captain George Stipling company he has received a whole pension the number of his pension certificate 9183. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain person engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

Real property I have none.

Occupation a farmer and not able to pursue it, in consequence of inability & rheumatism. But one in my family my wife Catharine of the age of 76 years
