State of Indiana Ss.

On this Twenty fifth day of May AD 1819 before me the subscriber one of the Circuit Judges of the State aforesaid personally appeared Terrence Conner aged 67 years resident in the County of Perry and State aforesaid, who being by me first duly sworn according to Law, doth on his Oath make the following Declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war." That he the said Terrence Conner in the year seventeen hundred and seventy six enlisted in the service of the United States, in Gallihu's [sic: Charles Gallahue's] Company Commanded by Lieut. Davis in the Eleventh Virginia Regiment Commanded by Col. Dan'l. Morgan [Daniel Morgan BLWt1496-850] that he continued in the service of the United States for more than three years that he was discharged at the Bush encampment on the North River by Gen'l. Wood [James Wood BLWt2419-500] in the year 1779 but has lost his discharge that he was in the Battles at Monmouth [28 Jun 1778], Brandywine [11 Sep 1777] & the storming Stony Point [16 Jul 1779]

That he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support and that he has no other Evidence in his power of his said service

State of Indiana Ss. in the Perry Circuit Court

Be it Remembered that at a Circuit Court continued and held for the Perry Circuit (being a court of record) in the State of Indiana at the Court house in Rome on the 20th day of March A.D. one thousand eight hundred & twenty one personally appeared in open Court Terrence Connor aged sixty six years resident in the County of Perry in s'd State who being first duly sworn according to Law, doth on his Oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows (to wit) that he enlisted in the State of Virginia & County of Prince William A.D. one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven in the Comp'y commanded by Capt Galihu in the 11th Virginia Reg't. commanded by Col. Daniel Morgan in the Brigade commanded by Gen'l [William] Woodford that he served three years & two months & was discharged by Gen'l Wood at the Bush encampment near North River, that he has a Wife aged 65 years & a Daughter named Margaret aged twenty years, both hearty that the date of his original Declaration is of the 28th of May 1819 and that the No of his pension certificate is 16841

I Terrence Connor do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain person engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed (to wit)
