Pension Application of Adam Darnall S35879 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. VA

Kentucky Washington Circuit Sct DISTRICT OF ss.

On this Ninth day of August 1819 before me, the subscriber, Judge of the Circuit Court for the Washington Circuit personally appeared Adam Darnall Sr aged65 years, resident in Washington County in the said district, who, being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:" That he, the said Adam Darnall Sr enlisted for the term of Two years on the 18th day of February in the year 1778 in Fauquir [sic: Fauquier] county in the state of Virginia in the company commanded by Captain John Blackwell of the Regiment commanded by Colonel Heath [sic: William Heth] in the line of the state of Virginia on the Continental Establishment; that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States, until the expiration of his enlistment when he was discharged from service in state of Virginia that he was in the battles of Monmouth [28 Jun 1778] and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.

District of Kentucky SS. Mercer County (viz)

On this fifth day of February 1821 personally appeared in open Court being a court of Record for the County of Mercer having power to fine & imprison Adam Darnall aged eighty years resident in Mercer County in said district & County who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: I enlisted with Con'I. John Blackwell in the 3^d Virginia Reg't. commanded by Col. Heath in February 1779 for two years & was at the Battle of Monmouth and various skirmishing parties and faithfully served out my time and was Honorably discharged I was in the Militia Service to take Cornwallis [at Yorktown, 19 Oct 1781] I am very infirm I have no trade & a wife and three children under age living and am unable to work for my support And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain person engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.
