State of Indiana [blank] County SS 2^d Judicial District

On this 14th day of June 1819 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Circuit Court for the District aforesaid personally appeared James Mahoney aged 56 years resident in Washington county in said district and doth on his Oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress an act entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States during the Revolutionary war. That he the said James Mahoney Enlisted at Petersburgh [sic: Petersburg] in the State of Virginia on the 10th day of March 1779 in the Company commanded by Capt Wales [probably Thomas Wells] of Col Abraham Buford's Battalion of General Charles Scott Brigade Belonging to the Virginia line, and that he continued to serve in said corps or in the service of the United States untill the month of August 1783 when he was Discharged from the service at Winchester in the State of Virginia by Col. Samuel Haines and that he was in the Battles of Cowpens [17 Jan 1781] Guilford [Guilford Courthouse NC, 15 Mar 1781] Camden [probably battle of Hobkirk Hill near Camden SC, 25 Apr 1781] Eutaw Springs [8 Sep 1781] and was wounded at the siege of Ninety Six [22 May - 19 Jun 1781] and that he is in reduced Circumstances and Stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and has no other evidence of said services than the accompanying this declaration.

Henry County State of Kentucky

Personally appeared before me Edmd. Searcy a Justice of the peace in and for said County duly appointed and Commissioned Benjamin Mahoney [possibly Benjamin Mahorney, pension application S32393] and made Oath that he was acquainted with James Mahoney and that he the said James Mahoney Enlisted in the Company Commanded by Capt Wales on the 10th of March 1779 in Petersburgh State of Virginia of Col. Abraham Buford's Battalion and that he served in said Corps or the service of the United States Untill august 1783 and that he has known him ever since and that he is in reduced Circumstances
