Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

The Commonwealth of Kentucky Montgomery County, Sct.

On this 7th day of July 1818, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the circuit court, in and for the state aforesaid, personally appeared James McCullough aged 62 years; — who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following statement and declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War;" that he is a citizen of the state of Kentucky, and resident in the County of Montgomery; and that he was enlisted for two years in Stafford County in the state of Virginia on or about the __ day of October 1776 by one William Washington and served in the company commanded by Captain William Washington of the 3rd Virginia Regiment (said Washington was afterwards Colonel of Cavalry) commanded for a short time by Colonel Darke [William Darke] —

that he continued to serve in said Corps, or in the service of the United States, in the Continental Army, against the common enemy, until about the __ day of October 1778 when he was honorably discharged from service at Fredericktown in the State of Maryland; that he was in the service for two years and was in the battles of Brandywine [September 11, 1777], Germantown [October 4, 1777] and some skirmishes –

and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has lost his discharge, and has no evidence in his power, of his services and discharge, other than what is hereto transmitted. Sworn and declared before me the day and year aforesaid

N. B. This James McCullough the present applicant is not the same man whose examination was taken and certified in behalf of John McCullough of the same date with the foregoing.
