Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Be it remembered that on this 20th July 1818 James Johnston a Citizen of the County of Logan & State aforesaid & made oath that on the 15th May 1776, he enlisted as a private soldier in Captain Thomas Chisolm's [Thomas Chisholm's] Company Regiment first commanded by Jos. Habersham [Joseph Habersham] Georgia Continental Troops -- that he continued in the service of the United States fighting against the British &c from the time aforesaid till the 15th May 1777 -- and was duly discharged on the 20th May 1777, which now accompanies this application -- That by reason of his reduced circumstances he stands in need of the aid of his Government for support -- and therefore prays the benefit of a law passed last session of Congress allowing support to persons in his situation. He also relinquishes to the Government his claim to any pension heretofore allowed him, war that was allowed by the Government of the United States.

This day James Johnston appeared before me B. Shackelford the Judge of the aforesaid circuit and subscribed and swore to the foregoing statement of facts and produced a certificate signed by Thomas Chisolm that said James served twelve months in the first Regiment of Georgia Continental troops commencing 15th May 1776 and ending 15th May 1777 certificate dated May 20th 1777. I am satisfied from the testimony of John Rotrammel [? sic, John Ro. Trammel?]<sup>1</sup> that the said James Johnston is in very low and needy circumstances and requires the assistance of his country for support. Given under my hand this 20th of July 1818.
