The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

Before me the subscriber one of the Justices of the peace in and for said County of Fayette. Personally came Thomas Chockley late a soldier in the revolutionary war, as he saith, residing and being in the County of Fayette Dunbar Township Pa. Who upon his solemn Oath taken before a Justice of the peace as aforesaid. Saith that he was a listed soldier in the service of the United States in the revolutionary war in the regular service Under General Green [sic: Nathanael Greene] of the Southern Army, Collonel [Richard] Campbell, Major Headman, and Captain Sansome [sic: Philip Sansum] First Virginia Regment of the Virginia line, that he was inlisted for eighteen months that he served his full time faithfully and was regularly and honorably discharged That he is now about sixty three years of age and is in indigent circumstances and stands in need of assistance of Government. Further saith not Sworn and subscribed before me this 19^{th} day of November AD 1819 Thomas his Cmark Chockley

NOTE: Thomas West, pension application S40667, certified that he had known Chockley as a soldier and "never heard of said T. Chockley acting in any way but such as became of good and faithful soldier."
