The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

## State of North Carolina, Montgomery County

On this 4<sup>th</sup> day of July 1820 Personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Record for the County of Montgomery Benjamin Bowles Aged fifty-five years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the Act of Congress of the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1818, and the first of May 1820, that he the said Benjamin Bowles enlisted for the term of 12 months on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year 1781 in the State of North Carolina in the Company Commanded by Captain Smith [Robert Smith] & was transferred to the Company Commanded by Captain Brevard [Alexander Brevard] in the 10<sup>th</sup> Regiment in the line of the State of North Carolina on the Continental establishment, that he continued to serve in the said Corps until the 12<sup>th</sup> of April 1782 when he was discharged from the service in the State of North Carolina in Chatham County.

That I assisted in taking Thomson's Fort [Fort Thomson] of the Congaree River & Brown's & Grayson's fort [Grierson's Fort] in Augusta Georgia [siege of Augusta May 22-June 6, 1781] and in pursuance of the Act of the first of May 1820 I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval Service of the U. S. in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me Subscribed that is one horse valued at \$30, one cow & calf valued at \$10, one small Bed valued at \$15 & eight or ten young [word omitted] were perhaps \$10 amount in all to \$65 & that my family consists of myself, my wife & my Daughters.

Sworn to and Declared on the 11<sup>th</sup> Day of July 1820.
