On this 25th day of October 1820 Personally appeared in Open Court being a Court of Record held in & for the County of Sampson, Moses Carter (a Man of Colour) aged Sixty nine years who being first duly sworn according to Law, doth on his Oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the Provisions made by the Acts of Congress of the 18th March 1818 and the 1st of May 1820, that he the said Moses Carter inlisted for the Term of eighteen months on the 19th of July 1782, that he served in Captain Joseph T Rhodes Company in the first Regiment of the North Carolina line in the Continental Establishment in the time of the Revolutionary war from the first of August 1782 until the first of July 1783 at which time he was discharged, and in Pursuance of the Act of the 1st of May 1820, I do solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United States in the 18th of March 1818 and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress Entitled "An Act to provide for Certain Persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War", passed on the 18th day of March 1818: that I have not nor has any Person in trust for me, any property or securities contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed & by me Subscribed. that he has no other evidence now in his Power of his services except what is hereunto annexed. I hereby Certify that Moses Carter Served as a private Soldier in the first Regiment of the North Carolina line on the Continental Establishment in time of the Revolution war That he joined my Company (as will as I can recollect) about the first of August in the year 1782 for the Term of Eighteen Months at which time I was a Captain in said Regiment I believe he served until the Soldiers of the army were furloughed and not called into service again

State of No Carolina Secretary's Office 15th June 1820

I William Hill Secretary of State in & for the State aforesaid, do hereby Certify, that it appears from the musterrolls of the Continental line of this State in the revolutionary war that Joseph J. Rhodes a Capt. in the 10th Reg't. was commissioned on the 10th day of Aug't. 1777. The time of his leaving the service is not mentioned. Given under my hand this 15th June 1820./ Wm. Hill

Personally appeared before me in Open Court Moses Tyler [W4090] who being sworn deposeth & saith that he is well acquainted with Moses Carter a man of Colour; that the said Carter served in the eighteen months service in the Revolutionary War in Captain Rhodes Company in the first North Carolina Regiment that as well as he can Recollect the said Carter was in service with this deponant about Eleven months, and was in service at the time peace was declared, that the said Carter is old & has lost his speech & is very feble, is a farmer
