Pension Application of Daniel Diall (Dial) S41506 SC NC Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. Revised 4 Dec 2014.

State of North Carolina } On this 8th day of September 1818, before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Superior Court of law & Equity of said State personally Surry County } appears Daniel Diall aged about Sixty five years resident in Surry County in the said State, who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval services of the United States in the Revolutionary War." That the said Daniel Diall enlisted in the Infantry in the State of SoCarolina [sic] in the Company commanded by Captain Micajah Lewis of the fourth regiment [of the North Carolina Continental Line] that he continued to serve in the said Corps, or in the service of the United States until the Capture of L Cornwallis [19 Oct 1781] when he was discharged from service in Surry County State of N Carolina that he was in the battles of Gates Defeat [defeat of Gen. Horatio Gates at the Battle of Camden SC, 16 Aug 1780], at the Cowpens [17 Jan 1781] & at the Eutaw Springs [8 Sep 1781] and that he in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services. Sworn to and declared before me, the day and year aforesaid Daniel hisXmark Diall

Surry County } On this fourth day of March 1819 before me the Subscriber one of the Judges of the Superior Courts of Law in and for the State aforesaid personally appeared Daniel Dial ages sixty six years resident in Surry County in said State who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision make by the late act of Congress, entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the revolutionary war, That he the said Daniel Dial enlisted in South [sic] for the term of three years, with Captain Lewis who commanded a Company of the fourth Regiment of the North Carolina line that he was transfered to the Company commanded by Captain Hickman, in the Sixth Regiment in the South Carolina line commanded by Col Pinkney [sic: Charles Cotesworth Pinckney], on the Continental establishment, that he continued to serve in the service of the United until after the capture of Lord Cornwallis at little York, which was some time after the term of his enlistment had expired, when he obtained his discharge from the service, in Surry County State of South Carolina, that he was in the batles of Gates defeat at the Cowpens and at the Eutaw Springs

And that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for Support.

State of NCarolina } Superior Court of Law Surry County } September term 1820

On this 5th day of September 1820 personally appeared in open Court it being a Court of Record so created and declared by the laws of the State of NCarolina and opened and held as such this day for the County of Surry Daniel Dial aged about 68 years resident in said County – who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows Viz. that he was drafted in the Company of what was Called nine months men [militiamen drafted into the North Carolina Continental Army] under Capt John Litten Jones that at Salisbury NC Capt Micajah Lewis of the 4th Regiment of New levies took the Command that he continued in said Company til about the time of the battle of Stono [Stono Ferry SC, 20 Jun 1779] when he enlisted in Capt Hixs Company of the 11th Reg't of the South Carolina line of Regular Troops Commanded by Colo Richard Pinkney [sic: William Hixt's company of the 1st Regiment commanded by Charles Cotesworth Pinckney] that he continued in

service til the capture of Cornwallis when he was discharged by Major John Armstrong in the County of Surry aforesaid that he was in the battles of Stono Gates Defeat Cowpens & Eutaw Springs all which he apprehends was exhibited in his former declaration made on the 8th day of September 1818 as appears from his certificate dated 26th day of March 1819 numbered 8675- And I the said Daniel Dial do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary war passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto anexed and by me subscribed. And I the said Daniel Dial on oath further declare that my property consists of the following articles Viz Seven head of cattle which is valued at fifty dollars Seventeen head of hogs at seventeen dollars nine pewter plates three small pewter basins six pewter spoons two knifes and one fork estimated to be worth about four dollars. That I am by profession a farmer and live on rented land. That I have generly been a healthy man til of late I have had the Rhumatism which disables me considerably from obtaining subsistence by my own labour. That I have only three children living with me Viz Jane Dial aged fifteen years and James aged fourteen years And I the said Daniel Dial on oath further declare that I owe debts to different persons to the amount (as nearly as I can recollect) of about fifty five dollars and fifty cents \$55.50 cents Daniel hisXmark Dial
