State of North Carolina } Court of Pleas and quarter Sessions Wayne County } August term 1818

Charles Gipson came into open Court and made oath upon the holy Evangelist of almighty God that during the Revolutionary war he enlisted at North Hampton [sic: Northampton] Court House in the State aforesaid as a Private Soldier under Capt. G Bradley [George Bradley] and served nine months in the North Carolina Continental Line in the Regiment Commanded by Col. Hogun [sic: James Hogun] and got an Honorable discharge at Philadelphia which he has lost

The Deponent further that while in service he took the small Pox, and caught cold, which greatly impaired his Health & Strength and rendered him much less able to labour than formerly. He further states that he is very poor, and has a wife to support and needs the aid of Government

State of North Carolina Secretary's Office 22<sup>nd</sup> Feby 1819

I William Hill Secretary of State in & for the State aforesaid do hereby Certify that it appears from the musterrolls of the North Carolina Line in the Revolutionary war, that Chas. Gibson enlisted as a private in said Line on the 20<sup>th</sup> July 1778 in Lt Cols company of the 10<sup>th</sup> Reg't for the term of nine months. The Rolls does not state the length of time he served, or when discharged.
