Pension application of Nathan Gwaltney (Gaultney) S41596 Transcribed by Will Graves f19SC 12/01/07 rev'd 12/2/15

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of North Carolina, Lincoln County: Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions July Sessions 1818

On this 23rd day of July 1818 in open Court personally appeared Nathan Gwaltney aged 65
years resident in Lincoln County State of North Carolina, who being first duly sworn in open Court
according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made
by the late act of Congress entitled, an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land & naval
service of the United States in the Revolutionary War. That he the said Nathan Gwaltney enlisted in
what is now Lincoln County formally called Tryon County, in the State of North Carolina in the
company commanded by Captain William Richardson of the 5th Regiment, but 1st Rifle Regiment of
South Carolina commanded by Col. Isaac Huger, afterwards General; that he enlisted about the last
March or first of April 1776 and continued to serve in the same company, (but commanded a part of the
time by Captain William Davis) in the service of the United States, until about 17th May 1777 when he
was discharged from service in Charleston State of South Carolina; that he was in no general
engagement or battle but was in a skirmish, which was at the Light house Island, and that he is in
reduced circumstances & stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, & that he has no
other evidence now in his power of his said services except what is annexed.

This 24th day of July 1818 Abraham Forney¹ came into open Court & made oath that he is well acquainted with Nathan Gwaltney who has signed the foregoing statement, that he was present when said Gwaltney enlisted in the service of the United States in the Revolutionary war under Wm Richardson Captain. I saw him sworn; that he lived a neighbor to him, & that said Gwaltney was absent from home 12 or 14 months generally believed to be in service, & heard he was in service.

State of North Carolina, Lincoln County: Superior Court of Law October Term 1820

The 26th day of October A.D. 1820 personally appeared in open Court, being a Court of record for the said County & State Nathan Gwaltney aged sixty seven years resident in said County of Lincoln & State of North Carolina, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath, declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows, that he enlisted under William Richardson Capt. of the Riflemen in the 1st regiment of said corps commanded by Colonel Isaac Huger in the line of the State of South Carolina Continental establishment, in the later part of March or first of April in the year of our Lord 1776 for the term of fourteen months, that he continued in said corps until the 17th May A.D. 1777 when he was regularly discharged in Charleston South Carolina, that he was in no battle and said Time except in a small Skirmish in the light house Island at Charleston (S.C.) that in the month of July AD 1818 he filed an affidavit and petition in order to receive a pension under the act of Congress of the 18th of March 1818 which was forwarded to the war department and that he received a pension Certificate from said department dated the 17th of October AD 1819 No. 15,249 and said deponent does further swear that he was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th of March 1818 and that he has not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of any property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war passed on the 18th of March 1818 and that I have not, nor has any person for me, any property, or security, contracts or debts, due me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the following schedule, hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

That I have no other Trade than that of a farmer or Tiller of the ground, and through age & infirmity he is unable to pursue that with much effect, that he has in [his] family no person besides himself, his wife aged 65 years, one daughter aged thirty years and one granddaughter aged nine years &c Sworn to and subscribed in open Court the 25th October 1820

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$8 per month commencing July 23, 1818, for one-year service as a private in the South Carolina Continental line.]
