[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of North Carolina District of Edenton Camden County

On the third day of November 1819, before me the Subscriber, one of the Judges of the Superior Courts of law and Equity for the said State personally appeared Mitchel Phillips planter, aged fifty-nine years, resident in Camden County in the said district who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth make on his oath the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" that he the said Mitchel Phillips planter enlisted for the term of three years on the \_\_ day of September in the year of 1777 in Camden County in the State of North Carolina in the company commanded by Captain Tillman Dickson [sic, Tilghman Dixon] and turned over to the 1st Regiment commanded by Colonel Thomas Clark in the line of the State of North Carolina on the Continental establishment; that he continued to serve in said Corps or in the service of the United States until he was taken prisoner at Charlestown in the State of South Carolina in the month of June 1781 [sic, Charleston South Carolina fell to the British on May 12, 1780] as well as he recollects, that he was exchanged and was discharged at old James Town in the State of Virginia that he was in many skirmishes and in the Siege of Charlestown South Carolina, and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said Services except the affidavits here annexed.

Philips a private in Captain Dixon's Company of the 1<sup>st</sup> Regiment was mustered on the 9th of September 1777 for three years -- The time of his discharge is not mentioned.

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$8 per month commencing November 3, 1819, for service as a private for 3 years in the North Carolina Continental line.]
