Pension Application of Thomas Cunningham S42664

Brown County } Ss on ths first day of April 1819 before me, the subscriber, one of the Associate Judges in and for the County of Brown, personally appeared Thomas Cunningham aged seventy seven years, second day of March 1819 resident in Huntington Town-Ship in said County, who, being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the united states in the revolutionary war. That he, the said Thomas Cunningham enlisted for the term of three years or during the war, on or about the last of March or first of April in the year, 1777 in Pittsburg in the State of Pennsylvania, in the Company commanded by Captain Henry Heath [sic: Henry Heth], called an independant Company raised by the state of Virginia and afterwards attached to the Eighth Pennsylvania Regiment commanded by Colonel Brad Head [sic: Daniel Brodhead], in the line of the state of Pennsylvania on the continental establishment; that he continued to serve in the said corps, untill the month's of June or July 1781, when he was discharged from the service in Pittsburg State of Pennsylvania – and that he is in reduced cercumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said servises.
