Pension application of Peter Lozier S42886 Transcribed by Will Graves f17NJ[VA] 11/3/12

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

The Declaration of Peter lazier formerly a Private engaged in the Service of the United States, during the Revolutionary War, and now a Citizen of the United States, and resident of the City of New York Respectfully Sheweth, that the said Peter Lozier enlisted at Hackensack in the year 1779 in the Company of Captain James Armstrong of the Partizan Legion in the Regiment commanded by Lieutenant Colonel Henry Lee [Light Horse Harry Lee] was at the battles of Springfield [June 23, 1780], Guilford Court House NC [March 15, 1781], Eutaw Springs [September 8, 1781] &c when peace took place and was discharged at the head of Elk now in the State of Maryland his discharge accompanies this affidavit.

And this Declaration further representeth that the said Peter Lozier is now a Citizen of the United States, and residing in New York aforesaid, and is by reason of his reduced circumstances in life, in need of assistance from his country for support; being now 57 years of age.

Therefore he conceives himself entitled to the benefit of the Act of Congress of the United States, entitled, "And Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States; in the Revolutionary War," approved, March 18, 1818, and request that your Honor will examine into the troops of the matters aforesaid, certify and transmit the testimony in this case, and the proceedings had their own to the Honorable the Secretary of the Department of War, to the end that such relief may be had in the premises, as is by law in such cases provided. And in support of the facts above set forth, he refers to the affidavit of himself and of Helebrant Lozier hereafter set forth dated the ___ day of April 1818.

Helebrant Lozier¹ of the City of New York being duly sworn doth depose and say he is well acquainted with Peter Lozier and knew him to serve in the Continental Army against the Common Enemy and served in the same company with him.
