that I have a wife by the name of Eve aged sixty six years as nearly as I have been able to asertain that she is old and infirm and unable to support herself with the aid of Public or private charity that I live in a log house, on the undivided lands in Morris & Coemans patent. I have no title to the same, but have entered there as a squatter — and pay rent to none. that I am liable to be turned off at the pleasure of the owner & that I have on the premises about three acres of improved land
