Pension application of William Howard S7042 Transcribed by Will Graves

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

State of North Carolina Mecklenburg County: Superior Court of Law November Term A.D. 1832 On this the 12th of November in the year of our Lord 1832 personally appeared before the said Court now sitting, William Howard a resident of the County and State aforesaid, aged in the 69th year of his age, who being first duly [sworn] according to law doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June the 7th A.D. 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein after stated.

Your declarant states that he was born in the State of Pennsylvania in Dinegal [sic?] County in the year of -64 - & his age is recorded in a Family Bible, which he has at his home -Was living in the County of Mecklenburg & State of North Carolina when called into service, & has lived in the same County & state ever since the Revolutionary War – Your Declarant states that he volunteered his services – never received a discharge from service. Your Declarant entered service in the year of 1781 – Sumpter [sic, Thomas Sumter] was General of the Army, & Henry Hampton was the Colonel [Lt. Col.] Commandant – Moore was Major of the Regiment to which your Declarant belonged Jacob Barnett was Captain – Marched from Mecklenburg County North Carolina on to the Congaree River in South Carolina – engaged in no Battle – served with no Continental Troops – Has no documentary evidence of his services – Was discharged from the same sometime in the year 1782. Your Declarant cannot recollect the precise time that he either entered or left the service, but is conscious of the fact that he served at least eight months. He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State. Sworn to and subscribed the day & year aforesaid.
