Pension Application of Basil Brown S9713 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

[The following document is in the pension records at the Library of Virginia:]

At a Court held for the County [Ohio County] on Monday the 6 day of July 1789 Present Zachariah Sprigg Isaac Meek Benjamin Biggs & John Henderson, Gentlemen, On Motion of Bazell Brown, Jun'r. for a Certificate to the Executive, Certifying that said Brown was wounded in the service of the state of Virginia under the Command of Collo. David Rodgers [see endnote], October the 4th 779 and as there is no surgeon in s'd. County to Examine the Disabilities of s'd. Brown, agreeable to an act of assembly in that case made & provided, the Court Proceeded to examine him, and it is thier Opinion, that his wounds Render him unable to get a lively-hood and therefore pray that he may Receive pay as a pentioner, A Copy Test/ Moses Chapline Clk O.C.

Dr. Foushee will please Examine the state of Bazil Brown's wounds./ J. Wood.

NOTES:

On 4 Oct 1779 at present Cincinnati, Indians under Simon Girty ambushed troops under Col. David Rogers, killing 57 out of 70.

On 12 May 1828 Brown applied to have his pension transferred to Pennsylvania, because in 1780 Fayette County had been found to be in that state rather than in Virginia.
