
[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

² Beginning on page 11 of this file, the documents therein relate to claims on behalf of the Estate of Edward Griffith. These documents are not separately indexed under Edward Griffin’s name. All of the documents relate to claims for sundries supplied for military use. On page 29 of this file there are documents relating to provisions impressed by Lieut. Charles Redman on behalf of the Company of Capt. James Lytton Richards. These are the only references I’ve seen to these two officers, as such. SC Audited Account 6374 contains a petition by James Lytton Richards asking to be licensed to run a ferry across the Ashley River, but the file does not contain a claim for service during the war.

[p 7: Reverse of the above Indent bearing endorsements by William Houseal, Thomas Waters, and Philemon Waters. How these men acquired an interest in the indent is not disclosed by the documents in this file.]


