
[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

[Note: The only reason this man's claim is included in the pension database is because of the above receipt issued by Col. Francis Lock [Francis Locke] of Rowan County NC militia. This receipt indicates that Lock and his men were in SC on September 16, 1781 and in possession of some British POWs. I've been unable to locate "Barkles Creek" [Barkley's Creek, Bartle's Creek, Bartels' Creek SC ?] where Lock says he was camped on that date. Lock is not listed in any order of battle I've seen for Eutaw Springs, but troops from Rowan County militia were there according to J. D. Lewis. Any help in solving the questions raised by this receipt would be appreciated.]
