Pension application of John Keith (Keeth) ¹ W11478 Nancy Smith² f70SC Transcribed and annotated by Will Graves 10/15/09: rev'd 3/28/16 & 3/20/23

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

District of Georgia SS Putnam County in the Superior Court held in & for said County being a Court of record by the Constitution & Laws of said State of the twenty-third day of August 1820 personally appeared in open court being a Court of record for the said district John Keith aged Sixty Eight years resident in Putnam County in said district who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows: he enlisted a private for Eighteen months in the State of South Carolina in Captain Mazicks [sic, probably Daniel Mazyck's Company Colonel Frank Marion's [sic, Francis Marion's Regiment in the year 1779 & continued in service until the Siege of Charleston South Carolina in 1780³ when he was taken prisoner [Benjamin Lincoln surrendered the patriot forces at Charleston to the British on May 12, 1780] by the British and detained 14 months & being exchanged he voluntarily joined Colonel Parker's [?] Regiment of militia from Virginia & continued in said service until the surrender of Cornwallis at York town in the year 1781 [October 19, 1781]⁴ & was at that place slightly wounded and made an original declaration⁵ of his said services to the general government claiming a pension in the spring of the year 1818 which has been returned being informal and he has never received any pension from his government for his revolutionary Services and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner whatever disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" passed on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property, or securities, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed and is possessed of 17 hogs of the value of \$44 forty pounds of bacon of the value of \$5.50 and no other estate real or personal (necessary clothing & bedding excepted) has heretofore followed shoe making, for several years being unable to do any harder work and from his age and infirmity is now unable to support himself

and that or any other way by his labor has a wife Nancy Keith who is about fifty-five years old & very infirm & unable to obtain a subsistence by labor and only one child a son named Memberance [?] Keith nine years old who composed the whole of his family and this is in such indigent circumstances as to be unable to support himself without the assistance of his Country.

District of Georgia SS Wilkinson County, in the Superior Court held in and for said County; being a Court of record, by the Constitution and laws of said state, on this 11th day of October in the year of our Lord 1823, personally appeared in open Court William Jinkins and John A. Trull (said court being a court of record for said District) and half of whom being duly sworn, do on their oath's say that they were acquainted with John Keith, now of Putnam County in said District of Georgia, in the time of the Revolutionary war; and that said John Keith entered in the state of South Carolina, on the Continental establishment, in Captain Mazeck's Company in Colonel Frank Marion's Regiment the said Regiment being the 2nd Regiment of the United States Infantry raised in South Carolina and that he the said John Keith served 9 months in said Corps in continuance. Sworn to and subscribed in open court on the day and year above written.

Original Claim

Georgia, Baldwin County

On this tenth day of November 1823 personally appeared in open court (the Inferior Court for the County of Baldwin, being made a court of record by the laws of this State) John Keith, resident in the County of Putnam & State aforesaid, aged seventy-one years who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the acts of Congress of the 18th of March 1818 & the 1st of May 1820; that he the said John Keith enlisted for the term of eighteen months, in February 1779, in the company commanded by Captain Daniel Mazikc [sic], in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Francis Marion, in the line of the State of the South Carolina on the Continental establishment (that he enlisted in the State of South Carolina); that he continued to serve in said Corps until May 1780, when he was made a prisoner: that in July 1781 he obtained his liberty &

was then discharged from said service in Virginia.

That he was in the attack on Savannah⁷ by General Lincoln [Benjamin Lincoln], in the battle of Stono [June 20, 1779],⁸ & in Charleston South Carolina during the siege of that place & that he has no evidence now in his power of his said services, his papers all being heretofore by casualty with his house, in Darlington County South Carolina.

And in pursuance of the act of the first of May 1820, I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner whatever disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war" passed on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property, or securities, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income whatever, nor any property, but the necessary bedding & clothing of my family.

[p 9: On November 17, 1854 in Bibb County Georgia, Nancy Smith, formerly Nancy Keith, 51 years old and a resident of Twiggs County, Georgia, made oath that she is the widow of John Keith a soldier of the revolution who received a pension of \$8 per month from the government for his service in the revolution; that John Keith died in Twiggs County Georgia February 10, 1839 aged 91 years; that she married John Keith in Twiggs County August 1, 1831 or thereabout; that on July 3, 1845 in Twiggs County she married William Smith who died March 30th 1852 since which time she has remained a widow; that her maiden name prior to her marriages was Nancy West. She signed her application with her mark]

[p 13: marriage license dated July 30th 1832 issued in Twiggs County for the marriage of Mr. John Keith to Miss Nancy West.]

[p 14: marriage license dated July 2nd, 1845 issued in Twiggs County Georgia for the marriage of William E. Smith to Mrs. Nancy Keith.]

[Veteran was pensioned at the rate of \$8 per month commencing March 1, 1823, for service as a private for 3 years in the South Carolina Continental line. His widow was pensioned in a like amount.]
