Pension Application of Thomas Flin (Flynn) W17908 Mary Flin VA Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. 12 Feb 2014.

I Thomas Flin of Danbury in the County of Fairfield and State of Connecticut being duly sworn depose and say that I served as a Soldier in the Army of the Untied States in the Revolutionary war for the term of six years commencing some time in the year 1776 or 1777 in the fifth Virginia Regiment command by Colo [Josiah] Parker in the Company commanded by Capt George Lambert and was honorably discharged at Philadelphia at the close of said war but have lost my discharge considering it of little value to me at this late period. I was in the Brigade commanded by Gen'l Mulenburgh [sic: Peter Muhlenberg]. I am poor and destitute of the means for a comfortable support being old and very infirm in body and must have help from my friend or the public and further say not

BE IT REMEMBERED, That in the County Court, held in and for the County of Fairfield in the District and State aforesaid, on this 18 day of July 1820 the same being a Court of Record, and having a Seal, under the Authority of said State, personally came and appeared in open Court, Thomas Flin aged sixty two years, resident in the Town of Danbury in the County of Fairfield in said State, and being first duly sworn according to Law, doth on his Oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War, as follows: as a private in the 5th Regiment of the Virginia line commanded by Gen'l Mulenburgh & in Capt Lamberts company from the year 1779 to the close of the War that the original Declaration made by him, for the purpose of obtaining a Pension, under the Act of Congress of the 18th of March, 1818, was dated first day of April 1818 that in pursuance thereof he was entered in the List of Pensioners, and received a Pension Certificate No. 4,797 And I do further solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed. And I do further declare that my occupation is that of a day labourer. I am very infirm with a swolen leg & a bad issue upon it & have not been able to do any work for several years and that I have a family residing with me consisting of a wife, Mary near my age, and am entirely dependant upon the public for support all which is subscribed by me the day and year aforesaid.

NOTE: On 3 Aug 1838 Mary Flinn, 80, applied for a pension stating that she married Thomas Flinn in Danbury CT on 8 Nov 1784, and he died on 24 Sep 1820. On 31 July 1838 Filor Mygatt, 72, stated that he was present at the marriage of Thomas Flinn and Mary Bedient, which was officiated by Joseph Peck, a Presbyterian clergyman.
